

Monthly Police Report

May 2018

Auto Accidents:

5/31- A one vehicle collision occurred on corner of North Drive and Gilcrest Road. Driver fled scene after causing minor property damage to hedges. Vehicle impounded by Fagan's Towing.

Aided Cases:

5/02-A resident of Arleigh Road tripped on wire while attempting to cross Middle Neck Road. Aided later reported incident to police after learning that the fall caused a broken ankle.

5/05-A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was transported to North Shore Hospital after violently vomiting at home.

- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- A 911 hang up was reported on Beverly Road was investigated and found to be dialed in error.
- A disabled motorist was located on East Shore Road and was assisted safely to the shoulder to wait for AAA
- A complaint of construction noise on Arleigh Road was investigated and found to be a truck idling with occupants waiting for 8am to start work. Occupants were advised to shut truck down until start time.
- Letters were sent out to several resident homes to remind them of failure to maintain property ordinance. Building department assisted.
- Police were notified by a passing motorist of screams for help in the vicinity of 206 East Shore Road. Police responded and checked vicinity with negative results. A canvas was also conducted with negative results.
- Several men were located on Arleigh Road soliciting for an exterminating company. A field interview and id's were taken and forwarded to NCPD detectives due to a similar call for service in Nassau County jurisdiction.
- A call for a loose dog was reported on Nassau Drive. The owner was notified after police were unable to corral the dog.
- A lost child, 3 years of age, was located while officers were on patrol. Officers were able to locate the child's parents in North Great Neck. NCPD was also notified and responded to scene for follow up. Child was returned to family without injury.
- A local case was filed for a resident involved in a dispute over the purchase of a puppy. Both parties were interviewed and the matter referred to civil/small claims court.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month to the village hall for repair.
- A hazardous condition on Nassau Drive was located and cleaned up with the assistance of highway department. A large amount of broken glass from an unknown source was on the roadway.
- A solicitor was located on Nassau Drive and advised of village ordinances and do not solicit list. Will comply.
- A medic alert activation was reported at a Beverly Road home. Upon arrival, police were advised that it was a false alarm.
- A disabled motorist was located at the intersection of Beverly Road and MNR. A tow was called to remove vehicle from intersection.
- A dispute between a homeowner on Arleigh Road and National Grid was mitigated and resolved by police.
- A suspicious vehicle with occupant on Greenacre Ct was investigated. The occupant of the vehicle was a parent waiting to pick up their child from a friend's house. All ok.
- Police responded to a call on Beverly Road in regards to wildlife inside the home. The police were able to get the wildlife to exit through an open window. Situation corrected.
- A report from a disabled person regarding a vehicle blocking the sidewalk on Gilchrest Road. The situation was corrected and vehicle relocated.
- A loose dog was located on East Shore Road. The dog was checked for a chip and address/owner information was ascertained and notified to respond.
- A disabled motorist was located on West Drive and Beverly Road. Vehicle was pushed to side of road to wait for tow truck.
- A report of a vehicle with a broken rear window was investigated on Arleigh Road. Unknown what caused glass to break. A check of the vicinity for cameras produced negative results.
