

Monthly Police Report

May 2020

Auto Accidents:

05/18-A 1 vehicle accident occurred on East Drive after the driver passed out and collided with a tree. No other injuries reported and minor damage caused to a tree located on private property.

Aided Cases:

05/10-A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was transported to North Shore Hospital after falling and suffering from shortness of breath.

05/20- Police responded to a Beverly Road home for a complaint of shoulder pain. Upon arrival aided was examined by medical personnel and refused transport to hospital or any further assistance.

05/20-A resident of Arleigh Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering from weakness. Aided was transported to North Shore Hospital.

05/22-Police responded to 1 Kensington Gate for a medic alert activation. Upon arrival it was determined that the signal had been set in error.

Ambulance Calls:

The Vigilant Fire Company Ambulance responded to all of the above aided cases.

Alarms:

The Department responded to active 1 alarm during the month, it was found to be a false burglar alarm.

Cases:

05/18-A report was taken from a resident on Nassau Drive after it was discovered that personal information had been used in an attempt to cash checks at a local bank. Report was for documentation purposes only.

05/20-A report was taken on North Drive for a couple engaged in a verbal argument. All paperwork forwarded as needed. No offenses committed.

Fires:

05/22- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to a general fire alarm. Upon arrival it was determined to be caused by burned food on the stove. No damage observed.

Larcenies:

Nothing to report.

Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 8. All were found to be secure.

Miscellaneous:

-Police responded to noise complaints on Beverly Road. Upon arrival it was determined that multiple youths were gathering in the rear of a home. Resident was spoken to and advised of multiple violations to village ordinance and executive order. Crowd was dispersed.

-Police responded to an Arleigh Road home at the request of homeowner for noises outside the home. A check of the exterior appeared normal and all doors/windows secure.

- Police responded to a noise complaint on Beverly Road. Upon arrival it was determined that several youths were gathering in the rear of a the home. Resident and parents were spoken to and advised of multiple violations to

village ordinance and executive order. Crowd was dispersed.

- Police responded to a complaint by an off-duty NYPD officer of a suspicious youth carrying a gas can. KPD assisted NCPD with a search of the area. The suspicious male was located attempting to start a fire and arrested at scene by NCPD. All paperwork filed. Subject also admitted to starting a fire in front of KPD HQ. No damage observed.
- Several landscapers were issued warning for violations of village ordinances throughout the month.
- A North Drive resident was assisted with a possible criminal mischief incident at the residence. After a brief investigation it was determined that the damage was inadvertently caused by a rock kicked up by landscaping equipment.
- A resident of Beverly Road was assisted with an ongoing identity theft issue. No report was necessary at the time but police will monitor for additional information.
- Police responded to a 911 hang up on Bridal Path. Upon arrival it was determined to be dialed in error by resident.
- A report was taken after damage was discovered to the gate at 180 East Shore Road. All paperwork filed and forwarded to village clerk.
- A resident of Nassau Drive requested a check of the interior of the home after interior cameras were set off by motion. The interior was checked and all appeared in order. Possible trigger was mail through the mail slot. After location mail person, timing of delivery supports that determination.
- While on patrol, police observed multiple vehicles parked at a vacant home. Upon investigation it was determined that the owner was having an impromptu gathering. Owner was made aware of numerous village and state violations and left scene voluntarily.
- A welfare check was conducted at 1 Kensington Gate at the request of the visiting nurse. An interior check was performed and subject was not located. The resident was later found to be out with a friend and in good health.
- A Nassau Drive home was found to be in violation of the executive order regarding social gatherings. The homeowner was advised of the violation and would comply.
- A report of erratic driving on North Drive was investigated. It was found to be a resident having issues with the vehicle. The vehicle was safely and legally parked and the resident driven home.
- Kings Point Police Department was assisted with a missing person report that was just reported. After a brief search of the area the subject was located and found to be in good health.
- A strange odor was investigated at 1 Kensington Gate on the 2nd floor. All parties at scene were unable to determine the source.
- Police assisted two residents when Fed Ex delivered packages to the incorrect address. An exchange between residents was conducted to facilitate a return to the proper owner.
- A loose dog was reported by a Nassau Drive resident. Upon arrival it was observed that the owner was walking with the dog, but no leash was being used. Dog owner was advised of the village ordinance and will comply going forward.
