Miscellaneous:

- NCPD was assisted with a canvass after a description of a robbery suspect was disseminated.
- A report of a loose dog on Nassau Drive was called into dispatch. Upon arrival, police were able to locate and catch dog. Collar tags were used to locate the owner and dog was returned unharmed.
- Police responded to an Arleigh Road home after a 911 hang up was reported by dispatch. Upon arrival, it was determined that police were dialed in error by a child at the home.
- A suspicious vehicle was reported on Nassau Drive taking pictures of a nearby home. Upon arrival it was determined to be a real estate representative with proper id/paperwork.
