Auto Accidents:

09/01- A two vehicle collision occurred at the intersection of West Drive and Nassau Drive. Both parties refused medical attention. Both vehicles towed from scene by Fagan's Towing.

Larcenies:

Nothing to report.

Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 15. All were found to be secure.

Miscellaneous:

- Police responded to a downed village light pole on Nassau Drive. Hwy department was notified to remove and make safe. After a short investigation, the driver who caused the damage was located and vehicle information was forwarded to village hall for reimbursement.
- Police observed a sink hole on the corner of East Drive and North Drive while on patrol. Hwy department was notified and the area was taped/coned off for safety
- A resident was assisted with a possible mail fraud issue. The issue was under the jurisdiction of the federal inspector and the victim was given the necessary information.
- A disabled motorist was assisted on East Shore Road. Motorist was moved safely off the roadway and driver to contact roadside assistance.
- While on patrol police observed an elderly female pedestrian who appeared in distress. Pedestrian was assisted back to residence but refused any medical attention.
- A report of a suspicious auto driving up and down Beverly Road was reported. Police canvassed area and surrounding vicinity with negative results.
- A report of a loose dog was investigated on North Drive. Upon arrival the caller advised that the dog returned home on its own. No further action needed
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Members of The Kensington Police Department participated in the NYS STEP enforcement initiative.
- PSE&G notified of power outage in village after inclement weather passed through the area in the overnight hours.
- Hwy department requested assistance on Arleigh Road to resolve possible dispute with builder. Situation was corrected with no further action needed.
- The roadways were cleared of debris after a severe storm causing large limbs to fall passed through the area
- A suspicious person was reportedly knocking on doors on Arleigh Road. Police responded and was unable to locate individual. A search of the area also produced negative results.
- NCPD was assisted with a pedestrian struck on MNR. Pedestrian sustained severe injuries to head and was transported to North Shore Hospital in NCPD ambulance.
