Auto Accidents:

Aided Cases:

09/15- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate refused transport to North Shore Hospital after falling in the bathroom. No injuries were reported and aided refused any further assistance.

09/03- Vigilant Fire Company responded to an active fire alarm at an Arleigh Road home. Burned food on the stove caused the alarm. No damage was reported

09/25-Vigilant Fire Company responded to an active fire alarm at a Beverly Road home. Upon arrival it was determined to be a faulty fire alarm sensor.

-A resident of 46 Nassau Drive requested police after an unknown male was ringing door bell. Upon arrival it was determined to be a delivery driver who had mistakenly delivered a package to the incorrect address and was attempting to retrieve said package.

- Police responded to a neighbor's complaint on Arleigh Road for a sprinkler operating continually for more than one day. House was vacant and entry was gained with key on file to shut off water. Realty notified and will respond to repair.
- Police responded to a noise complaint in the vicinity of Arleigh Road and Park Road. Upon arrival it was determined to be youths leaving a home nearby. The group was instructed to lower the volume and call for a ride home. All complied.
- Police responded to a Stoner Avenue home at the request of a resident in reference to a tree being removed without proper permits. Upon arrival it was determined that the company had the proper permits. No further action required.
- Police responded to a neighbor dispute regarding an ongoing parking issue. Situation was resolved.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month to the village hall for repair.
- Police were called to a Beverly Road home for a trapped animal. The animal was freed from its location without injury.
- Police were called to a Beverly Road home for a neighbor dispute over debris placed on the property line. Both parties were spoken to and the situation was corrected.
- In an effort to increase pedestrian and school bus stop safety, the Kensington Police Department participated in a Directed Enforcement Initiative targeting aggressive driving within the village.
- Police responded to reports of screams heard on Sutton Court. Upon arrival it was determined to be coming from a party where young children were playing a game.
- Police responded to an Arleigh Road home for a water main break. The home is currently under construction. GN Water Authority and several town officials were notified and responded to repair the break.
- Police responded to take an accident involving village report for a downed light pole on Nassau Drive.
- While on patrol police stopped a vehicle after observing erratic driving behavior. The driver and passenger were identified and questioned as to their actions and were released from scene without further action.
