

# Monthly Police Report

## November 2018

### Auto Accidents:

11/07-A two vehicle collision occurred at the intersection of Arleigh Road and Gilchrest Road. No injuries reported. One vehicle towed from scene  
11/15-A minor two vehicle collision occurred on Nassau Drive after inclement weather caused one vehicle to slide down the hill into the other. No injuries were reported and no tow needed.  
11/23-A vehicle struck a bicyclist at the intersection of Gilchrest Road and Arleigh Road. The bicyclist was transported to North Shore Hospital after complaining of head pain/contusion.

### Aided Cases:

11/09-A resident of Arleigh Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering from an undetermined issue.  
11/12-A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering from vomiting and internal bleeding.  
11/17-A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering various symptoms due to a medication change.  
11/23-A Great Neck resident was riding a bicycle on Gilchrest Road and was struck by a vehicle. Bicyclist was removed to North Shore Hospital after complaining of head pain/contusion.  
11/25-A resident of Arleigh Road was assisted in the home after a fall to the floor. No injuries were sustained from fall and all medical attention was refused.  
11/27-A resident Great Neck visiting a home on Beverly Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering symptoms of a high fever.

### Ambulance Calls:

The Vigilant Fire Company Ambulance responded to all of the above aided cases.

### Alarms:

The Department responded to 7 active alarms during the month, all were found to be false burglar alarms.

### Arrests:

### Assists:

Assistance was given to Great Neck Estates Police Department 26 times, and received from Great Neck Estates Police Department 7 times.

### Cases:

11/09- A Criminal mischief/Attempted Burglary was reported on Arleigh Road. Rear door was broken but no entry gained and nothing was reported missing. Elderly resident was notified along with family members. GNEPD and NCPD assisted. A canvass of the area produced negative results.

### Fires:

11/09--Vigilant Fire Company responded to a fire alarm on Arleigh Road. Upon arrival it was determined to be a false alarm set off by construction workers in the home. No damage.

11/29-Vigilant Fire Company responded to a complaint from a resident on North Drive stating there was a strong odor of gas in the vicinity of the home. It was determined that there was a gas leak in the rear yard on Arleigh Road. National Grid was notified and responded. Scene was deemed safe and repair of pipe was scheduled and completed. No damage.

**Larcenies:**

Nothing to report.

**Vacant Homes:**

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 12. All were found to be secure.

**Miscellaneous:**

- While on patrol, police observed an open/unsecured fence at a construction site on Arleigh Road. The site appeared ok and the fencing was secured upon exit.
- A Life Alert alarm was received from a resident of 1 Kensington Gate. Upon police arrival it was deemed to be set in error. No medical attention needed.
- The members of the Kensington Police participated in a Directed Enforcement Initiative aimed at bringing awareness to pedestrian safety.
- While on patrol, police observed an open door on Beverly Road. After checking the first floor, the resident was located and unaware that the door was open.
- Assistance was given to a resident of Arleigh Road after a car battery died. A portable jumper was used to get vehicle running.
- Large limbs were removed from the roadway after a severe storm that passed through the area caused them to fall. All roads remained passable and highway department notified.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month to the village hall for repair.
- A defective traffic signal light on East Shore Road was reported as steady red for north and southbound traffic. Repair company was notified and responded for repair.
- A Life Alert alarm was reported for a resident of 1 Kensington Gate. Upon police arrival it was deemed to be set in error. No medical attention needed.
- A loose dog was observed running across East Shore Road. Dog was recognized by police and returned to owner. An Appearance Ticket was issued to the owner of the dog after multiple warnings had been previously issued.
- While on patrol, police observed an open door on Arleigh Road. After checking the first floor, the resident returned home and was unaware that the door was left open. All ok.
- Lost property was located and returned to owner on East Shore Road after proper identification was established.
- A Beverly Road resident was assisted after a tree fell onto their vehicle while parked in the driveway. Highway department assisted.
- A suspicious person was observed in the vicinity of 3 Arleigh Road. Subject was identified and purpose verified. Subject was released from scene.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
