

# Monthly Police Report

## November 2020

### Auto Accidents:

11/08-A legally parked vehicle was struck by another vehicle that fled scene before exchanging information. No surveillance footage available.

### Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 7. All were found to be secure.

### Miscellaneous:

- Police responded to a Bridal Path home after a report of a dangerous tree was reported. Tree in question was leaning on power lines. PSE&G was notified for resolution. Village hall notified as well.
- While on routine patrol a downed light pole was discovered on Beverly Road. A accident involving village was filed and the electric company was notified.
- Two appearance tickets were issued after observing a landscaper operating equipment in violation of village ordinances.
- Police were called to an Arleigh Road home to assist resident with equipment at the home. Condition was corrected.
- A resident of North Drive requested police check the interior of the home after strange noises were heard by homeowner. A check of the interior produced negative results.
- A suspicious incident was reported at an apartment in 1 Kensington Gate. After an investigation, it was determined to be unfounded.
- Police responded to a 911 hang up on Nassau Drive. Upon arrival it was determined to be a verbal argument among two workers on site. One of the workers voluntarily left scene. The homeowner and the construction company owner was notified of the issue and no further police action was requested/required.
- A complainant responded to police hq to file a harassment report against his brother. The facts surrounding his complaint did not meet the threshold of the violation at the time of the complaint. No police action.
- A suspicious vehicle with occupants was reported on Arleigh Road. Upon arrival the vehicle and occupants were located and after a brief investigation, released from scene without issue
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Police responded to a report of young children unattended in the vicinity of Beverly Road and Gilcrest Road. A canvass of the location and surrounding area produced negative results.
- A 911 hang up at an apartment in 1 Kensington Gate. After arriving at scene it was determined to be dialed in error.
- Police were requested to respond to the vicinity of Arleigh Road and Beverly Road for a loud explosion. Upon arrival it was determined to be a blown transformer due to inclement weather. PSE&G notified and responding.
- A report for documentation was taken at HQ for a resident that had personal information used to open a credit account. No charges or loss at time of report.
- Police were called to assist with a disabled vehicle at Beverly Road and Park Lane. Vehicle was unable to remain started and a tow truck was called for removal.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month to the village hall for repair.
- A homeless individual was reported to be sleeping in Kensington Park. Subject was located and found to be resting on his lunch hour. All ok.
- A resident of Beverly Road was warned about having a dog off its leash after a complaint was received by a passing pedestrian.
- A wellness check was conducted at an Arleigh Road home after a relative was unable to contact the resident. Police responded and checked interior with negative results.
