

Monthly Police Report

June 2021

Auto Accidents:

06/01- A guest of a Beverly Road home was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering from altered mental status and a head laceration as a result of an earlier fall at his Kings Point home.

06/01- A Great Neck resident visiting a doctor on Beverly Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering from general illness symptoms.

06/03- A one vehicle accident occurred on East Shore Road after a vehicle struck the overhang of a building. No significant structural damage to the building, no injuries reported and no tow.

Miscellaneous:

- Police removed several large limbs from roadway after a heavy winds and rain storm caused them to fall
- An accident involving the village report was filed after a construction vehicle struck and knocked down a village owned light pole. All paperwork filed with village clerk and highway department notified.
- A North Drive resident requested police to assist with lost items. The items were recovered after a short investigation.
- Police assisted with a disabled motorist on Nassau Drive. The vehicle was unable to be started and a tow truck was called to respond for further repair.
- Nassau County PD was assisted on East Shore Road after a two-vehicle accident shut down one lane. Both parties exchanged information and the road was reopened.
- A noise complaint was reported in the rear of 1 Kensington Gate. Police responded but was unable to locate the violation.
- A noise complaint was reported on North Drive at a construction site. Police responded and observed large machinery being used to demolish existing house. Noise was unavoidable and work would be completed shortly. No violation.
- A suspicious vehicle was reported on the corner of Beverly Road and Gilchrest Road. Vehicle was located and driver questioned. Driver states mechanical issues with vehicle forced him to stop. Vehicle was subsequently able to run and drive away. No tow needed.
- Kensington Police assisted several other police jurisdictions in the search for an elderly male who went missing. Subject was eventually located unharmed and in good health.
- Dispatch requested police to respond to Arleigh Road and Park Lane for assistance. Upon arrival it was determined that the motorist was extremely lost and required directions to leave the area.
- A report was taken for documentation purposes only after a verbal argument between a parent and child. The child responded to HQ to request assistance. All proper paperwork was filed and detectives notified.
- A local report was taken for documentation purposes only after a package went missing from the porch of a Nassau Drive home.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- Construction sites were monitored throughout the month for proper permits and ordinance violations.
