Auto Accidents:

Miscellaneous:

- Police observed a suspicious vehicle on Nassau Drive with all doors ajar and no one in the vicinity of the vehicle. Owner of vehicle was located a short time later and all paperwork and ID verified.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- A resident on Beverly Road was assisted after being locked out of the home. Entry was gained by way of key on file.
- A loose dog was observed on Nassau Drive. The owner was located and dog returned without issue.
- A report of fireworks was investigated on Nassau Drive. Police were unable to locate the origin of the complaint.
- Temporary/No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Police investigated a possible road rage incident that was reported on Beverly Road. After an extensive search, the subjects were unable to be located.
- Police assisted Nassau County Hwy blocking off a loose and dangerous man hole cover on East Shore Road. Road was buckled and unsafe after heavy rains undermined parts of the roadway.
- Police were called to a possible stalking/road rage incident. Both parties located and spoken with. No violation was committed by either party and they were released from scene.
- A lost wallet was turned in to HQ with a valid ID. The owner was contacted and responded to HQ to retrieve lost property.
- A suspicious person was reported knocking on doors in the vicinity of Sutton Court. Police responded and canvassed the area but were unable to locate anyone matching the description given.
- A noise complaint on Beverly Road was reported. Upon arrival it was determined to be loud music coming from the rear yard. Homeowners were advised of the disturbance and instructed to comply with noise ordinance.
- Police responded to a dispute between a landscaper working on Arleigh Road and neighboring homeowner. The situation was mediated and resolved.
- The building inspector was assisted with a stop work order for a home on Arleigh Road after it was discovered that work was being performed without proper permits.
- A suspicious person was reported in the vicinity of Greenacre Court. Police responded and canvassed the area, but were unable to locate anyone matching that description.
- Police were called to assist Kings Point after two subjects were arrested and one fled the scene. An extensive search was conducted throughout the night within the village confines with negative results.
