- Police were requested to check the exterior of a Beverly Road home after the resident reportedly heard a loud banging noise. A thorough check of the exterior was conducted and no signs of disturbance was observed.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- Police removed several large limbs from roadway after a heavy winds and rain storm caused them to fall
- Assistance was given to Kings Point PD after a stolen vehicle was reported. Two subjects were placed into custody on Arleigh Road and the third was located and arrested on MNR.
- A dislodged manhole cover was reported on Gilchrest Rd and Station Road. Police were able to locate and reinstall cover.
- The traffic signal at East Shore Road and Arleigh Road was malfunctioning and steady red for both directions of travel. The signal was reset to flashing red until repair company could respond.
- Construction sites were monitored throughout the month for village ordinance violations and permit violations.
- Police responded to an Arleigh Road home for a 911 hang up. Upon arrival it was determined to be dialed in error by resident.
- A Great Neck resident was assisted at HQ regarding an incident that occurred at a MNR business. Complainant was referred to NCPD for documentation purposes.
- A resident of Beverly Road requested a search of their home after hearing loud noises emanating from inside the home. Police arrived and searched the home. All appeared unscathed and nothing appeared disturbed.
- A Nassau Drive resident was assisted after getting locked out oof the home. A key on file was used to gain entry.
- NCPD was assisted with road closures on East Shore Road after a road crew doing work caused unsafe driving conditions.
- The highway department was notified after a windstorm toppled a village tree and it landed on a home causing damage. Homeowners on scene. Area was taped off for safety.
