

# Monthly Police Report

## November 2021

### Auto Accidents:

11/01- A vehicle struck a pedestrian at the intersection of North Drive and Station Road. Pedestrian was transported to hospital with hip pain.

11/17- A two vehicle collision occurred in front of a North Drive home. A driver struck an unoccupied parked vehicle. Two occupants were transported to North Shore hospital by Vigilant FD and one vehicle towed from scene.

### Aided Cases:

11/02- A patient at a doctor's office on East Shore Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after feeling lightheaded and general sickness symptoms. Aided transported by NCPD ambulance.

11/05- A resident of queens visiting a doctor on East Shore Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering symptoms of sepsis.

11/10- A resident of a Nassau Drive home was treated for difficulty breathing by medical staff at the home. Aided refused transport and any further medical assistance.

11/11- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering symptoms associated with an infection.

### Ambulance Calls:

11/19- A report of a verbal dispute was taken at a Nassau Drive home. No violations were reported or observed.

As a safety precaution, the gas was turned off and the basement vented. Homeowner advised to contact burner company. No damage or injuries reported

11/11- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to a Beverly Road home for a fire alarm. Upon arrival it was determined that the detector was set in error by a hairdryer. No damage or injuries reported

### Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 9. All were found to be secure.

### Miscellaneous:

- A suspicious vehicle with occupants was reported in front of a Beverly Road home. Vehicle was gone upon police arrival. Police spoke with complainant and canvassed area but were unable to locate vehicle in question.
- Workers were removed from a Beverly Road construction site and issued a warning for village ordinance violation.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- A lost property report was taken for documentation purposes after a pedestrian reported walking down Beverly Road and lost their wallet.
- Workers were removed from a North Drive construction site after the building department shut down project due to a lapsed permit.
- Building department was notified of a construction site performing work outside the scope of the issued permit. Building inspector notified to do a site visit.
- Nassau County PD was assisted with traffic control on East Shore Road due to a traffic accident with injuries.
- A suspicious truck was reported on Nassau Drive. Police responded and located the vehicle. It was found to be rented by a resident who was using it to move furniture.
- A wellness check was conducted at a Nassau Drive home at the request of a family member. Contact was made and the person was found to be ok. No further assistance was requested.
- A report was taken for a resident who lost their handicap parking pass. Report for documentation purposes to acquire a replacement.
- A resident located several boxes of bullets while moving furniture in the home. They requested the police respond and remove bullets to dispose of correctly. Three boxes were removed and secured until they can be properly disposed of.
- The interior of an Arleigh Road home was checked at the request of the homeowner after an open garage door was observed when they arrived home. All appeared ok and no sign of forced entry observed.
- Police observed several bags of financial documents partially blocking the roadway at the intersection of Arleigh Road and East Drive. Owner of documents was located and papers returned. Owner stated that he was on his way to have them shredded when they fell out of vehicle.
- A report of loud music was reported on North Drive. Police responded to the area and was unable to verify the complaint.
- A disabled motorist was assisted with a stalled vehicle at the intersection of Beverly Road and Park Lane. The vehicle restarted and motorist drove from scene.
- A disabled motorist was assisted on East Shore Road with a flat tire. Tow truck was called prior to police arrival.
- A found dog was reported at North Drive and Gilchrest Road. A chip reader was used to get owners information and dog was returned shortly after.
- Highway department was called to Bridal Path to remove a dead animal from the roadway.
- Police were called to a noise complaint of dogs barking on Arleigh Road. Upon arrival the dog was heard barking excessively. The owner was issued a warning and will comply going forward.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
