

# Monthly Police Report

## October 2021

### Auto Accidents:

10/14- An accident report was taken after a vehicle struck the overhead portion of a building while attempting to park. No injuries and no tow.  
10/19- A two vehicle collision occurred at the intersection of Beverly Road and East Drive. One vehicle towed from scene and one occupant transported to NSUH.  
10/25- A one vehicle auto accident was filed after a vehicle was backing up and struck a village owned light pole. All paperwork forwarded to village hall for processing.  
10/28- A one vehicle auto accident was filed after a vehicle was driving e/b on Beverly Road and started to smoke. Driver exited vehicle to find flames emanating from under the hood. Vigilant fire company extinguished fire and Fagan Towing removed vehicle from roadway. No injuries.

### Aided Cases:

10/02- A resident of Arleigh Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering symptoms of low blood pressure.  
10/03- A resident of Sutton Court was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering a fall in the home. Resident fell down a short flight of stairs the evening prior and was in severe pain upon arrival.  
10/06- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was assisted back into bed after a fall at the home. Aided refused any further medical attention or transport to the hospital.  
10/19- An occupant of a motor vehicle accident was transported to North Shore Hospital after experiencing chest pains.

### Ambulance Calls:

The Vigilant Fire Company Ambulance responded to all of the above aided cases.

### Alarms:

The Department responded to 6 active alarms during the month, all were found to be false burglar alarms.

### Assists:

Assistance was given to Great Neck Estates Police Department 14 times, and received from Great Neck Estates Police Department 5 times.

### Fires:

10/01- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to an Arleigh Road home for a CO2 alarm. Upon arrival it was determined that the detector was faulty. No damage or injuries reported  
10/07- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to an Arleigh Road home for a CO2 alarm. Upon arrival it was determined that the detector battery was failing. No damage or injuries reported  
10/29- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to a Beverly Road home for a carbon monoxide alarm. Upon arrival it was determined that there was a readable amount of CO2 in the home. No occupants were in the home at the time. The cause was found to be a faulty heating unit on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor. The heater was disabled and the home aired out.

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Police were unable to contact owners with information on file. A PAR was left to advise owners to contact PD for further information. Home was secured upon exit and no damage was reported.

### Larcenies:

Nothing to report.

### Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 6. All were found to be secure.

### Miscellaneous:

- A manhole cover on the corner of Beverly/MNR was dislodged due to heavy rains. Cover was located and set back in place.
- Assistance was given to tow operator assigned by bank to remove vehicle from a driveway in village. All paperwork was verified and a copy kept for files.
- An accident involving village report was filed for a vehicle that struck a light pole on Nassau Drive. All paperwork forwarded to village hall for processing.
- A manhole cover was dislodged on Nassau Drive due to storm conditions. Cover was located and set back in place.
- A disabled motorist was assisted on Nassau Drive with a flat tire. Police were able to change tire for motorist and send on their way.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- A noise complaint was reported on North Drive. Police responded and determined the noise was emanating from a party outside the confines of the village. NCPD was notified and responding.
- A suspicious person walking on Nassau Drive was reported. Person matching the description was located and questioned. All information and id checked out and the pedestrian was sent on his way.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- A suspicious vehicle with occupant was reported at a home on Beverly Road. Police responded and located vehicle. After speaking with occupant, it was determined that he was a business owner collecting payment for a completed job. Situation verified by homeowner.
- Kensington PD assisted GNEPD and NCPD with traffic control during a festival in town which required several road closings.
- Police assisted an Arleigh Road resident after they returned home to an open garage door. Interior was checked at the request of the homeowner. All found to be in order.
- A disabled motorist was reported on Beverly Road. Police responded and was able to jump the vehicles battery. Situation was corrected and motorist drove away from scene. No tow.
- A report of suspicious person(s) on Beverly Road was investigated. Upon arrival it was determined to be federal FEMA workers assessing damage after a recent storm.
- A resident of Beverly Road requested police after concerns of danger due to an electrical device in the home. Police responded and disabled the device and advised resident to call for repair as a precaution.
