

Monthly Police Report

September 2021

Auto Accidents:

09/08- A two vehicle collision occurred at the intersection of Arleigh Road and Gilchrest Road. No injuries were reported and one vehicle was towed from scene.
09/12- A two vehicle collision occurred at 156 MNR. One vehicle overturned and crashed through the front of the building. Multiple injuries were sustained to motorist and patrons of the store. Multiple jurisdictions were involved and assisted with the rescue and investigation of the incident. Proper reports filed with NCPD and Nassau County DA.
09/16- A two vehicle collision occurred at the intersection of Beverly Road and Gilchrest Road. No injuries were reported and one vehicle towed from scene.

Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 8. All were found to be secure.

Miscellaneous:

- Police assisted building department with a stop work order at a Beverly Road construction site for various violations of the building code.
- A resident of Nassau Drive was assisted back into the home after being accidentally locked out. A key was on file at hq and used to gain entry.
- Police were called to assist a resident of Beverly Road with an animal nuisance issue. The situation was corrected without issue.
- NCPD received a call for possible dispute with an open line. Police responded to scene and were unable to locate complainant. A check of the area was also unsuccessful.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Police assisted with an ongoing unsecured dog issue on Nassau Drive. Owner of dog was spoken with and the ordinance explained. Owner will comply going forward.
- A resident of Nassau Drive was notified of a water issue on their property. Will contact repair company to fix the issue.
- Temporary/No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- A suspicious vehicle was reported on Beverly Road. Police responded and located the vehicle and occupant. Proper ID was obtained and motorist was lost due to incorrect address given by online contact.
- A disabled motorist was located and assisted on the corner of Beverly Road and Nassau Drive. Situation was corrected and motorist was sent on their way.
- NCPD was assisted with a drunk and disorderly subject at the corner of Fairview Ave and MNR. Subject was placed into custody and transported to North Shore Hospital for evaluation and care.
- A resident of Greenacre Court requested police search the interior of the home after an open door was discovered upon arrival home. A check of the interior was negative for any suspicious activity.
- A report was taken after a worker allegedly stole construction equipment from a Beverly Road construction site. All paperwork filed and NCPD detectives were notified.
- A Nassau Drive home reports glass on a slider in the back of the home was smashed. Break does not appear suspicious and the cause of the damage most likely due to passing storm.
- Police responded to multiple complaints of flooding due to a severe rain storm that quickly moved through the area and caused severe damage.
