Auto Accidents:

None

Aided Cases:

08/18- A visitor to 1 Kensington Gate was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering stomach pain in the lobby.

08/20- A resident of Nassau Drive was transported to North Shore Hospital after feeling faint and dizzy.

08/21- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was transported to North Shore Hospital after having general sickness and wanted to be further evaluated.

08/31- A resident of Beverly Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after a fall in the home.

Ambulance Calls:

The Vigilant Fire Company Ambulance responded to all of the above aided cases.

Alarms:

Cases:

08/12- A report for Identity theft was taken on Nassau Drive for documentation purposes only after suspicious activity at the complainant's bank. No loss at time of report

08/24- A report was taken at a North Drive home after two occupants had a verbal altercation. All paperwork was completed and forwarded to NCPD detectives.

Fires:

08/13- Vigilant Fire Company responded to a Beverly Road home for a smell of smoke. Upon arrival it was determined that the smell was emanating from a bonfire set by the neighbor which was extinguished shortly before police arrival

Larcenies:

Nothing to report.

Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 40. All were found to be secure.

Miscellaneous:

- A resident noticed an open door at their neighbor's home and notified the police. When police arrived and checked the interior, the owner was located and advised police that the door was accidentally left open.
- A suspicious auto was reported in the vicinity of Arleigh Road. The vehicle in question was located, parked legally and unoccupied at the time of observance. Vehicle information was recorded and kept on file.
- Police were requested to assist the building inspector at a Nassau Drive home after a report of extensive work without proper permits was being performed. Upon completion of the inspection, a stop work order and summons was issued.

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- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Kensington Police assisted Kings Point Police with a suspicious auto traveling s/b. Vehicle was followed and was lost at the Queens border.
- Suspicious male was reported on Beverly Road and East Drive. When police arrived, they located a male matching the description given. Subject was cooperative and identified. All checked out and sent on his way.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- A resident of Nassau drive was assisted after being locked out of home. Police were able to gain access without damage.
- A resident of Sutton Court was assisted with a lost/stolen license plate. Report filed.
- While on patrol, police observed a dumpster placed on park property. Driver advised that his equipment was malfunctioning and it was only temporary. Driver information taken in case of damage.
- A suspicious auto was reported in front of a North Drive residence. Upon arrival the vehicle was located and driver questioned. Driver was in vehicle with their parent practicing for their road test.
- Police were called to a Nassau Drive home for a dispute between the contractor and homeowners. Police advised that it was a civil matter but the contractor was allowed to remove all tools and belongings before leaving.
- A suspicious male was observed at the park removing things from a stored vehicle. The subject was questioned and after a short investigation, his permission to remove the equipment was verified.
- Police were called to 1 Kensington Gate for a suspicious person knocking on doors. Upon arrival the subject was located and identified as a resident who was confused and trying to get back to her apartment. Police assisted resident and spoke to husband who was unaware of what had transpired. Both parties refused medical attention or transport.
- Police were alerted to an alarm ringing on the vicinity of Gilchrest Road and Beverly Road. Upon arrival the source was located and found to be caused by faulty equipment. Resident was notified to have repaired.
- A dislodged man hole cover was found on North Drive. Several attempts to correct issue was unsuccessful and cones were placed around it for safety and the DPW was notified for repair.
- An Arleigh Road resident came home to an open garage door and requested police check the interior. A perimeter and interior check was completed and all appeared in order.
