### Auto Accidents:

### Fire:

02/15- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to an Arleigh Road home for an active CO2 alarm. Upon arrival it was determined to be a faulty detector. No damage.

### Miscellaneous:

- Police investigated a complaint of several youths knocking on doors in the vicinity of North Drive and West Drive. No damage was caused and a canvass of the area produced negative results.
- Manhole cover dislodged on Nassau Drive was reset back into proper seat.
- Resident on Nassau Drive was notified that a tree had fallen across their driveway. No damage observed but tree was blocking access to driveway.
- Suspicious vehicle with occupant was reported on Bridal Path. A vehicle matching the description given was located on North Drive. Driver identified and cause verified. All ok and motorist released from scene.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Resident on Beverly Road reports suspicious noise heard on ring camera. Police responded and checked exterior. All appeared ok and resident was notified via landline.
- A noise complaint between neighbors on Arleigh Road was mediated by police and the situation was resolved without issue
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- Police were called to an Arleigh Road home for a missing juvenile. Upon arrival to the home, the missing juvenile arrived home in good condition. No further action required.
- Police responded to a village meeting after receiving a panic alarm. An irate resident was interrupting meeting but commotion subsided upon police arrival. Police remained at scene for duration of meeting. No further police action required
- Police were notified of a suspicious vehicle on Bridal Path. The vehicle matched the description and location of the unmarked police vehicle for the Kensington Police on routine patrol. No further action required.
- Kensington Police Department assisted the Nassau County PD in the search for a missing juvenile. The missing was later located in good health.
