

Monthly Police Report

JULY 2022

Auto Accidents:

07/11- A light pole was struck on Nassau Drive by a vehicle who fled scene without reporting accident. After an investigation the motorist was located, a summons was issued and report filed.

07/20- A bicyclist was struck by a motor vehicle at the intersection of Gilcrest Road and North Drive. No injuries reported and police were not originally called to the scene. A short time later the parent of the bicyclist reported the incident and took the bicyclist to North Shore Hospital for evaluation. Report taken.

Aided Cases:

07/06- A resident of Sutton Court was medically evaluated at the request of a third party. Aided was in good health and refused transport or further medical attention.

07/10- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was transported to North Shore hospital after suffering ankle pain from a fall in the home.

07/10- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was assisted back into bed after a fall in the home. No injuries were reported and aided refused any further medical attention or transport.

07/11- A resident of North Drive was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering abdominal distress.

07/17- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was found unresponsive by a family member. Police and medics responded and deceased was pronounced on scene by Vigilant EMT. NCPD detectives and medical examiner notified and all paperwork filed and send to squad. Aided was released to the funeral home requested by the family.

07/18- A resident of Beverly Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering abdominal pain

07/20- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was found unresponsive by the hospice worker. Police and medics responded and deceased was pronounced on scene by Vigilant EMT. NCPD detectives and medical examiner notified and all paperwork filed and send to squad. Aided was released to the funeral home requested by the family.

Ambulance Calls:

The Vigilant Fire Company Ambulance responded to all of the above aided cases.

Alarms:

The Department responded to 4 active alarms during the month, all were found to be false burglar alarms.

Larcenies:

Nothing to report.

Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 28. All were found to be secure.

Miscellaneous:

- Police were called to a Beverly Road home after the homeowner reported someone was knocking on rear door. Upon arrival, a check of the exterior and surrounding areas produced negative results.
- Police were called numerous times regarding a domesticated animal issue withing the village. After numerous inquiries and locating the owner, an amicable resolution was reached.
- Police responded to a dog off leash call in the vicinity of East Drive and Nassau Drive. Upon arrival there was no violations observed and a check of the area was completed with negative results.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Police responded to the vicinity of Beverly Road and Gilcrest Road for a suspicious vehicle. Upon arrival the vehicle was unoccupied and legally parked. Information was taken and vehicle was monitored.
- Nassau County PD called for Kensington PD to respond to a Kensington Court address for a welfare check of a male resident. Upon arrival it was determined that all appeared ok and the initial reason for the check had occurred several towns away. No further police action required.
- Police were called to a Beverly Road home at the request of the neighbor who observed a motion light activation at the neighbor's rear yard. Police responded and check ed the exterior. All was found to be secure.
- Police were called to a North Drive home for a possible attempted criminal mischief. Upon arrival and after a brief investigation, the issue was unfounded.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- A suspicious vehicle with occupant was reported on West Drive. Upon arrival it was determined that the motorist was lost and trying to get directions. Police were able to instruct driver and vehicle was sent on way.
- A possible aided case was reported on Station Road behind Village of Kensington Properties. Police responded and located a male sitting on the sidewalk. Subject was interviewed and found to be walking in the area and stopped to take a break due to the extreme heat. Subject refused any assistance or medical attention.
- A resident of Nassau Drive was issued an appearance ticket for damage to village property and leaving the scene of an accident after it was determined that the driver had struck and knocked down a light pole the previous day. All paperwork filed and delivered to subject and village hall.
- A noise complaint was reported on North Drive. Police responded and a verbal warning was issued to the resident who will comply immediately.
- A welfare check was requested at a home on Nassau Drive by the owner's son. Police responded and were able to reach the resident. Subject appeared in good health and stated that the phone line was down and she could not answer the phone.
- Police were called to a North Drive home for an unknown problem. Upon arrival it was determined to be a neighbor dispute that was civil in nature. Both parties referred to civil court and were advised to refrain from talking to one another.
