

Monthly Police Report

May 2022

Auto Accidents:

05/12- A two vehicle collision occurred on East Shore Road just North of Arleigh Road. Minor damage to vehicles. One driver fled scene without exchanging information. All information and report taken and forwarded to 6th squad. Driver that left scene was later arrested by squad.

05/22- A two vehicle collision occurred on East Shore Road just North of Arleigh Road. No injuries and no tow.

Aided Cases:

05/03- A resident of Beverly Road was treated and transported to North Shore Hospital due to a laceration on the leg.

05/07- A resident of Arleigh Road was assisted back into wheelchair after a fall in the home. No injuries and aided refused any further medical attention or transport.

05/12- A resident of Arleigh Road was assisted back into wheelchair after a fall in the home. No injuries and aided refused any further medical attention or transport.

05/13- A North Drive resident was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering symptoms of weakness and general illness symptoms.

05/17- An Arleigh Road resident was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering symptoms of cardiac distress.

Ambulance Calls:

The Vigilant Fire Company Ambulance responded to all of the above aided cases.

Alarms:

The Department responded to 21 active alarms during the month, all were found to be false burglar alarms.

Arrests:

Assists:

Assistance was given to Great Neck Estates Police Department 17 times, and received from Great Neck Estates Police Department 3 times.

Burglaries:

Cases:

05/04- A report was taken for Grand Larceny/Identity Theft after victim noticed that a large sum of money was transferred out of the account. All paperwork filed and forwarded to NCPD detectives.

05/12- A report for menacing and leaving the scene of an auto accident was taken and forwarded to NCPD 6th squad detectives. Complainant requested an arrest and had identifiable evidence of subject. The subject was later identified and arrested by NCPD in Glen Cove.

Fires:

05/06- Vigilant Fire Company responded to a Greenacre Court home for a CO2 detector activation. Upon arrival it was determined to be caused by a running vehicle parked in the garage. Home was ventilated by fire department. No damage.

05/11- Vigilant Fire Company responded to a Bridal Path home for a smoke detector activation. Upon arrival it was determined to be caused by burnt food on the stove. No damage.

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Larcenies:

Nothing to report.

Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 18. All were found to be secure.

Miscellaneous:

- A suspicious person was reported in the rear of a home on North Drive. Police responded and located subject who had proper ID and paperwork. Subject was verified as a utility worker for optimum cable. Homeowner notified of results.
- A suspicious vehicle with occupants was reported in the vicinity of Arleigh Road and Gilchrest Road. Police responded and canvass the area with negative results.
- A resident on North Drive requested police assistance with damage to a rear door. Police responded and determined that the damage was not consistent with forced entry but possibly due to a construction defect.
- Police assisted village hall with delivery of property maintenance letters to residents not in compliance with village ordinance.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- A suspicious person was reported by passing motorist on Nassau Drive. Police responded and were unable to locate subject by description given.
- Kings Point PD was assisted with a canvass/search of the area after a vehicle with out of state plates was taken without permission.
- Police responded to an Arleigh Road home for a noise complaint between neighbors. The ongoing situation was mediated and both parties were advised of the others complaints.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- A resident of Arleigh Road requested police assistance with an electrical issue in the home. Police responded and were able to correct the issue.
- New resident packet dropped off at a Bridal Path home and services and ordinances explained.
- A noise complaint was reported to dispatch at a home on Nassau Drive. Police responded and spoke to homeowners. Will comply best as possible. Police responded back later in the evening and advised to shut off music. Homeowners voluntarily complied.
- A report of a barking dog was reported in vicinity of Park Lane. Police responded and were able to locate dog on balcony of an Arleigh Road home. Police were able to contact owner and correct situation.
- Police responded to a Nassau Drive home after a 911 hang up was reported by dispatch. Upon arrival it was determined to be dialed in error.
- Police responded to a report of two suspicious male's w/b on Beverly Road. Both subjects were located and identification produced. Their purpose was verified, information was documented and both were sent on their way.
- Police responded to North Drive after a report of an unsafe parking condition. Upon arrival there were no unsafe conditions observed.
- Police responded to North Drive in response to a report of a neighbor dispute. Upon arrival it was determined that it was a tree issue that was causing the argument. All work was stopped and the building department notified to rectify the issue.
- Police responded to a call of shots fired on Arleigh Road. A canvass of the area produced negative results. NCPD was called and verified that there were confirmed fireworks being used in the area.
- Police assisted with traffic control on Beverly/MNR for crane work being performed at 1 Kensington Gate. Crane company provided their own flagmen and equipment for the duration.

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- A report of solicitors was called in on Nassau Drive. Police responded and located subjects. No permit or permission was issued by village and subjects were asked to leave and get proper permit since village hall was closed. They voluntarily complied.
- Police responded to a Nassau Drive home for a flooding condition. Upon arrival it was determined to be caused by a malfunctioning ejector pump. Situation corrected.
- An open door at a construction site was observed while on patrol. The interior was checked and all appeared undisturbed. Door was secured upon exit.
- An elderly female was assisted to her doctor's office after taking a detour and became disoriented.
