

# Monthly Police Report

## October 2022

### Auto Accidents:

10/19- A two vehicle collision occurred on Beverly Road. No injuries were reported and one vehicle was towed from scene.

### Aided Cases:

10/02- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering from difficulty breathing.

10/05- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was assisted after fall in the home caused a laceration to the arm. Aided refused transport but was treated by medics on scene.

10/10- A resident of Arleigh Road was assisted by police after a possible allergic reaction to medicine. Aided refused transport but was administered oxygen at scene by ambulance staff.

10/23- A motorist requested an ambulance after pulling over on the corner of Nassau Drive and Gilchrest Road after attempting to drive to hospital. Motorist was transported to North Shore Hospital suffering from severe abdominal distress.

10/25- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was assisted after a fall in the home. No injuries were reported and aided refused transport or further medical attention.

10/27- Vigilant Fire Company responded to a North Drive home for a general fire alarm. Upon arrival it was determined that the alarm was caused by a faulty detector. No damage.

### Larcenies:

### Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 20. All were found to be secure.

### Miscellaneous:

- Police were notified of two M/H men harassing women as they passed by. Information taken and forwarded to NCPD due to location of occurrence.
- The building department was assisted with a stop work order at an Arleigh Road home after construction was being conducted without proper permits.
- Kensington Police assisted several other local police departments after a vehicle was reported stolen in Kings Point. Vehicle was located and traveling at a high rate of speed entering New York City. NYPD notified.
- A report of a disoriented male in front of 1 Kensington Gate was investigated and determined to be unfounded.
- A stolen vehicle was recovered in New York City and detectives needed alarms removed to return vehicle to victim. All alarms removed and Nassau County Detectives notified of the recovery.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- A possible attempted vehicle larceny was reported on Stoner Ave. No vehicle or property was removed from location. A possible description of a vehicle involved was broadcast to surrounding jurisdictions and camera footage filed.
- An odor of something burning and heavy smoke was observed while on patrol. After locating source of smoke, it was determined to be someone cooking on a BBQ and burning their lunch. No injury or damage reported.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- While on patrol, police observed someone placing signage on village property. Subject was warned of violation and removed signage from property.
- A trucking company was assisted with information and form in regards to a property damage accident that occurred in New York City.
- A report of a disoriented female was reported on Beverly Road. Police responded and after an extensive search, were unable to locate the aided.
- A resident of Arleigh Road requested police to check the interior of their home after hearing a strange noise. The interior was checked and nothing appeared to be out of order.
