

Monthly Police Report

Auto Accidents:

None.

Aided Cases:

01/02- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was assisted back into bed after rolling off and was unable to get back up. No injuries were reported and aided refused any medical attention or transport to hospital.

Ambulance Calls:

Burglaries:

- Police responded to a suspicious person caught on ring camera of a Beverly Road home. Subject was located in vicinity and stopped for questioning. Subject had valid id and was performing a service for the home in question. All paperwork and employment verified. Subject released from scene.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Contractors were removed from village when operating during prohibited times. All were compliant and left scene.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- Police responded to a 911 hang up call at 1 Kensington Gate. Upon arrival it was determined to be dialed in error.
- A report of an unknown male urinating on the sidewalk in front of 1 Kensington Gate was investigated. Police were unable to locate anyone matching the description given.
- Police responded to a Nassau Drive home after the resident reports returning to the residence and the front door was ajar. A checked of the interior appeared ok and resident verified that all was in order.
- A wellness check was conducted at an Arleigh Road home. Spoke with adult son at residence who verified no issues with elderly mother.
- A suspicious vehicle was reported on Beverly Road and Gilchrest Road. Police were unable to locate vehicle matching the description given.
- Police responded to a call for fireworks in the area of Station Road and Gilchrest Road. Upon arrival, witnesses reported several youths fleeing scene on foot. A canvass of the area produced negative results. No damage observed.
- Kensington Police assisted NCPD with a road closure on East Shore Road after electrical wires ignited on fire. No injuries reported.
- A report was taken for an accident involving the village when an unknown vehicle struck and knocked down a village light pole on Nassau Drive.
