### Auto Accidents:

### Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 22. All were found to be secure.

### Miscellaneous:

- Police responded to Arleigh Road for a flooding issue. Heavy rains forced debris into drains. Debris was cleared and water resided.
- Police were called to respond for a suspicious vehicle on Beverly Road. Vehicle in question was gone upon arrival and a search of the area produced negative results.
- While on patrol, police observed a parking condition at a construction site causing a hazard for motorists and pedestrians. The issue was corrected and the contractor agreed to be more vigilant in monitoring worker and delivery vehicles.
- A resident of Nassau Drive reported a suspicious vehicle in front of their home. Police were able to locate vehicle and verify their ID and purpose. Motorist was released from scene.
- A parking condition on Greenacre Court was reported. Upon arrival, police were able to locate the home that was having a gathering and requested some vehicles to move. All guests complied and resident was advised to call prior for no parking signs to prevent issues in the future.
- Police were called to a neighbor dispute on Nassau Drive. A neighbor was complaining about the others landscaper blowing debris onto their property. Police spoke with all parties involved and the situation was corrected., No further police action required.
- A noise complaint was called in from a construction site on North Drive. Upon arrival it was determined that the workers were operating the radio excessively loud. Spoke with contractor and the situation was corrected.
- A resident on Beverly Road was locked out of home. Police were able to gain access without damage.
- A mailman on his route reported to police a disoriented elderly female. Police responded and located the woman. After an extensive interview the police were able to ascertain the woman's' address and drive her home. Family member at the home reports that the woman suffers from dementia.
- A suspicious vehicle was reported on Sutton Ct. Upon arrival the vehicle was no longer at scene. A check of the area produced negative results.
- A resident of Arleigh Road reported a lost dog. Police located the dog several blocks away and returned to owner unharmed.
- Police assisted a disabled motorist on Arleigh Road. Vehicle was incapacitated in the lane of traffic. Police assisted with moving the vehicle off the roadway and securing a repair company to respond.
- An Arleigh Road resident returned home to find the garage door ajar and requested police for a search of the home. Police checked interior and exterior. All appeared in order.
- A resident of Nassau Drive was locked out of home. Police were able to gain access for the resident without damage.
- Police were called to an Arleigh Road home after a possible threat to the schools was sent to a resident via text. NCPD and school personnel were notified and would follow up with Intel to determine legitimacy. Threat originated on an obscure social media platform.
