Auto Accidents:

Larcenies:

Nothing to report.

Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 18. All were found to be secure.

Miscellaneous:

- Police were called to a North Drive home for a suspicious person in the rear of the home. Resident observed unknown subject on video doorbell. Upon arrival, police located subject and after a brief investigation, were able to determine that the vendor was at the wrong address. Proper paperwork and ID were obtained and subject was released and given directions to proper location.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- A local report was filed for missing package at a Nassau Drive home.
- Police were called to a Beverly Road home for a disoriented elderly female. Upon arrival, it was determined that the female was suffering from dementia and was unable to find her home or give police any information. After a short investigation, police were able to ascertain her home address and returned her home. The relatives there refused medical attention and were not aware she had left the home.
- Police assisted a resident who responded to HQ with a social media issue. Police were able to assist resident in removing the complaint from their account. No further police action required.
- A resident of Beverly Road was assisted with a possible scam that had occurred at the home. Police spoke with both parties and situation was resolved.
- A suspicious vehicle was reported in front of a Beverly Road home. Upon arrival the vehicle was unoccupied. The drivers of the vehicle were located several homes away. Workers were doing work at several different homes and parked in between., All paperwork and ID verified.
- Police assisted a resident of Arleigh Road after being locked out of the home. Access gained without damage.
- Police responded to a noise complaint on North Drive. Upon arrival it was determined that the noise was reasonable and not in violation of any ordinance. No police action required.
