

# Monthly Police Report

## June 2023

### Auto Accidents:

06/20- A two vehicle collision occurred at the intersection of Beverly Road and West Drive. No injuries reported and no tow required.

### Aided Cases:

06/03- A resident of Nassau Drive was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering from vomiting and blurry vision.

06/03- A resident of Arleigh Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering symptoms of possible CHF.

06/09- A resident of Nassau Drive was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering from difficulty breathing.

06/09- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was found unresponsive by family. Paramedics on scene and pronounced aided. All paperwork filed and medical examiner notified to respond.

06/10- A resident of Arleigh Road was assisted after a fall in the home. Aided refused any further medical attention or transport.

06/12- A pedestrian was walking in front of 1 Kensington Gate when she felt faint due to low blood pressure. Aided was transported to North Shore Hospital.

06/16- A resident of Beverly Road was assisted after a fall in the home. Aided refused any further medical assistance or transport to the hospital.

## Miscellaneous:

- A resident requested assistance in gaining entry to their residence after being locked out. Entry was gained by officer on duty without damage.
- While on routine patrol, an officer located and assisted a disabled motorist on Nassau Drive. Situation was corrected and motorist went on their way.
- A suspicious person was reported in the rear yard of a Beverly Road home. A canvass of the area was conducted and the subject was not located. Video surveillance was reviewed and showed a subject with flashlight. Subject appeared to be looking for their lost dog in the bushes.
- An open hydrant was reported on Clifford Lane. A call to the water authority verified that it was a scheduled hydrant flush and that all was in order.
- A report of indecent exposure in the vicinity of Gilcrest Road. An extensive search of the area produced negative results. Description was shared with other local departments.
- A solicitor was reported on Nassau Drive. Subject was located and advised of village ordinance. Subject was unaware and would leave voluntarily and file for a permit at a later date.
- A resident was away on vacation and requested police to gain entry into their home to check the status of an appliance. Entry was gained and all appeared in working order.
- While on routine patrol, an officer located and assisted a disabled motorist at the intersection of Beverly Road and MNR. Situation was corrected and motorist went on their way.
- An Arleigh Road resident requested police assistance in gaining entry into their home. Access was gained without damage.
- A suspicious person was reported on North Drive. Complainant states that subject was possibly soliciting. A canvass of the area was conducted with negative results.
- An elderly woman was located on North Drive and appeared to be confused and disoriented. Police were able to gather her information and contact family. Police responded to their location to reunite them with their mother who suffers from dementia.
- A report of a missing child was called into HQ from an Arleigh Road home. The child was located by police shortly after the initial call. Upon further investigation, a domestic incident report was filed due to a verbal argument between father and daughter.
- A noise complaint was observed by police while on routine patrol. The daughter of the homeowner was on scene and spoken to. The situation was corrected and youths were dispersed.
- A disoriented female was observed on Arleigh Road and recognized by police from a previous encounter. Female was returned to her family on Arleigh Road and left in their care.
- An Amazon driver was assisted after being locked out of his delivery vehicle. Access was gained with no damage to vehicle.
- A resident on Nassau Drive requested police assistance with a health aide. Upon arrival it was determined that the complainant suffers from Dementia and was having an episode. Situation was corrected and no further assistance was required.
- While on patrol, police observed that the light pole was knocked down on Sutton Court. Police filed the damage to village property report and notified highway department to make safe until replaced.
- Police were alerted that pedestrians were being yelled at by several youths while walking on North Drive. Police responded and located the youths. Both the youths and their grandmother were spoken to and the situation was rectified.
