

# Monthly Police Report

## May 2023

### Auto Accidents:

05/27- A one vehicle collision with property occurred in the vicinity of Nassau Drive and Park Road. A vehicle was backing up and struck a village light pole, knocking it to the ground. No injuries. Appearance ticket issued.

### Aided Cases:

05/07- A resident of Arleigh Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering hip pain due to a fall in the home.

05/07- A member of the Kensington Police Department was injured while assisting Great Neck Estates PD. Aided transported to North Shore Hospital by NCPD ambulance.

05/14- A pedestrian was walking on West Drive when an argument ensued between aided and spouse. Aided was transported to North Shore Hospital due to disorientation and possible intoxication.

05/15- A resident of Beverly Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering severe stomach pain.

### Ambulance Calls:

The Vigilant Fire Company Ambulance responded to all of the above aided cases.

### Alarms:

The Department responded to 13 active alarms during the month. All were found to be false burglar alarms.

- A loose dog was observed while on patrol. Dog was bleeding heavily and police were able to contain dog and locate owner by a collar tag. Dog was returned to owner for treatment.
- A relative of an Arleigh Road resident responded to HQ to retrieve a key to check on the house while the resident is away. All was in order and key returned to hold for homeowner.
- A report of a suspicious male in a vehicle possibly suffering a medical issue. Vehicle matching the description was located on Beverly Road but found to be unoccupied. A search of the driver was conducted with negative results.
- A loud explosion was reported in the vicinity of Allenwood Park. A canvass was conducted with NCPD with negative results
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- Police were called to a North Drive home in regards to a property maintenance issue. Situation was resolved and village hall notified of disposition.
- A complaint of an erratic motorist driving an electric scooter on Beverly Road. Police responded and were able to locate a scooter off to the side of the road. Subject was spoken to and a verbal warning was given.
- A resident of North Drive requested assistance with locating an elderly relative who went for a walk and had not returned in several hours. Relative was located a short time later.
- A verbal argument between two parties was reported on West Drive. Police arrived to find husband and wife arguing over domestic issues. Proper paperwork completed and one party was transported to the hospital for safety precautions.
- Police responded to a Grace Ct address after reports of loud music were called in. Police spoke with subject and advised of excessive noise. Subject will voluntarily comply and keep music to a reasonable level.
- A resident of Nassau Drive reports a sink hole in front of their home. Police responded and located the hole. Traffic cones were placed for safety and highway department was notified of the issue.
- Several landscapers and contractors were given warnings for attempting to work during prohibited hours. All voluntarily complied.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Several calls were received regarding a sick wild animal. Animal was eventually located deceased and removed by highway department.
- A suspicious male was reported in the rear of an Arleigh Road home. Upon arrival it was determined to be a rear neighbor who was walking through a ravine that separates the properties. Male was no longer at scene. No police action needed.
- A disabled motorist was assisted on Nassau Drive with a flat tire. Situation corrected and motorist sent on way.
