

Monthly Police Report

Auto Accidents:

08/17- A two vehicle accident occurred at the intersection of Beverly Road and Gilcrest Road. One vehicle towed from scene. No injuries reported.

Aided Cases:

08/01- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was assisted after a fall in the home. Aided refused any medical attention or transport.

08/01- A resident of Arleigh Road was assisted by police after a fall in the home. Aided refused any further medical attention or transport to hospital.

08/01- A resident of Arleigh Road was taken to North Shore hospital for a welfare check after an incident in the home caused substantial pain.

08/03- A resident of Arleigh Road was transported to North Shore Hospital by Hatzalah after suffering from severe back pain.

08/10- A resident of Beverly Road was assisted after a fall in the home. Aided refused any medical attention or transport.

Cases:

08/01- A case report was taken in regards to a domestic incident on Arleigh Road. One subject was removed to the NCPD detectives for processing. All paper work was called in and forwarded as required.

08/24- A case report was taken in regards to a deceased male who passed from natural causes. Medical examiner and detectives were notified and paperwork forwarded as required.

Fires:

08/04- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to an Arleigh Road home for a fire alarm. Upon arrival it was determined to be burned food on the stove. Food was removed and home vented. No damage.

08/11- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to an Arleigh Road home for a fire alarm. Upon arrival it was determined to be set in error by resident changing a detector battery. No damage.

08/12- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to a Nassau Drive home after a passerby reported smoke. Upon arrival it was determined that a resident was using a BBQ and there was no fire. No damage.

08/22- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to a North Drive home for a fire alarm. Upon arrival it was determined to be set in error. No damage.

08/28- The Manhasset-Lakeville Fire Company responded to an East Shore Road business for a fire alarm. Upon arrival it was determined to be set in error by workers. No damage.

Larcenies:

Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 32. All were found to be secure.

Miscellaneous:

- A suspicious person was reported on Nassau Drive in the vicinity of West Drive. Police responded and canvassed area and were unable to locate anyone matching the description given.
- A resident of Nassau Drive was assisted after being locked out of the home. Access was gained without damage.
- A suspicious vehicle was reported in the vicinity of Nassau Drive and East Drive. Vehicle was located and found to be unoccupied. Information was taken and vehicle monitored for parking violations.
- Police responded to a Beverly Road home after receiving a noise complaint. Resident was advised to lower music and agreed to comply. Several minutes later police again received a noise complaint at the same address and responded and shut down party and monitored the departure of all guests.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.

- A report of a loud explosion and power outage in the vicinity of Nassau Drive and Clifford Lane. Police were unable to determine location of transformer explosion. Power company notified and responding.
- A 911 hang up call was investigated and found to be dialed in error by resident of West Drive.
- A noise complaint was reported and investigated on North Drive and determined to be unfounded.
- A report was filed for damage to village property after a light pole was found to be

- A tree limb from a neighbor's tree struck a home on Beverly Road. Minimal damage caused and both involved parties notified.
- A Stoner Avenue resident reports youths knocking on door and running. Video footage verifies complaint but unable to identify youths. A canvass of the area produced negative results.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- A report of solicitors in village was investigated. Police located several solicitors and advised of village ordinance. Will comply.
- A report was filed for damage to village property after a light pole was found to be knocked down in the vicinity of Arleigh Road and Beverly Road.
- Kensington Police assisted Nassau County PD on Stoner Ave after a vehicle struck another vehicle and pedestrian.
