Auto Accidents:

- Traffic light on East Shore Road was reported malfunctioning. Upon arrival, it was determined that the light was not cycling normally. Repair company notified and traffic light was manually switched into caution mode until repaired.
- A resident of Nassau Drive called to report the rear window of the vehicle parked in the driveway was shattered. Upon arrival police determined that the window was shattered by a falling branch. No criminality was involved.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- A suspicious vehicle was reported in the driveway of a Beverly Road home. Upon arrival it was determined to be a livery driver picking up a neighboring resident, but pulled into the wrong driveway.
- Nassau County PD assisted on East Shore Road after receiving a suspicious person call. The subject was located and purpose verified. No further police action required.
- A local report was taken for a Beverly Road resident after personal information was used to open a communications account without permission. No loss at this time.
- Nassau County PD was assisted with a minor two vehicle collision on East Shore Road. Accident occurred in NCPD jurisdiction and both motorists involved denied a report.
- Police observed a motorist on Beverly Road with a flat tire. Motorist was assisted with changing out tire with spare from vehicle and sent on way.
- Heavy rains unseated several man hole covers on Nassau Drive and Arleigh Road. Police were able to reseat covers after rain subsided.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- A local report was taken for identity theft for an Arleigh Road resident whose identity was used to cash a check at a local bank. No loss to the victim at time of report.
- Assistance was given to an Arleigh Road resident after the family was locked out of the home. Access was gained without damage.
- Kensington assisted in the search for a missing vulnerable adult called into Nassau County PD. Kensington PD located a person matching the description on Arleigh Road/Beverly Road. NCPD advised and responded to scene to verify. Missing was properly identified and escorted back to family members waiting at a local synagogue.
- A wellness check was conducted for a resident of Nassau Drive and the request of an out of state family member. Upon arrival it was discovered that the resident was in good health. Family was notified of the findings.
- An Accident involving the Village report was filed after a construction company knocked down a light pole on Kensington Court. Highway department notified and report was forwarded to village clerk.
- A noise complaint was reported on Nassau Drive. Police responded and determined the noise was not excessive. No police action required.
- A resident of Kensington Court was assisted after a water leak was unable to be rectified. The main was shut off until a repair company could respond for repair.
