

Monthly Police Report

September 2023

Auto Accidents:

09/01- A two vehicle collision occurred at the intersection of Beverly Road and Gilcrest Road. No injuries were reported and no tows required.

09/28- A two vehicle collision occurred at the intersection of Beverly Road and MNR. Both vehicles towed from scene and one person was taken by ambulance to North Shore Hospital.

Aided Cases:

09/02- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was assisted after a fall in the home. Aided was transported to North Shore with undetermined injuries.

09/14- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was assisted after a critical O2 machine malfunctioned. Oxygen was administered to aided and they were transported to hospital until a new machine could be acquired.

- home. Police and fire were on scene to secure area and PSE&G notified to respond.
- Roadways were kept clear of debris from fallen tree limbs during several storms throughout the month
- Police assisted the building department with a stop work order at an Arleigh Road construction site after it was discovered that work was being performed without the proper permits.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Police were called to an Arleigh Road home after a report of construction being done without permits. Upon arrival it was determined that the work needed to be paused and homeowners were advised to respond to the building department for further instructions.
- An Accident involving Village form was filed after an on-duty officer was involved in accident with a police vehicle. All proper notifications were completed and no injuries were sustained to the officer involved.
- Police responded to an Arleigh Road home to facilitate a court authorized entry for one of the residents to retrieve personal belongings.
- A resident of Arleigh Road was locked out home and called police for assistance. Police were able to gain entry without damage.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- While on patrol, police observed a male in a parked vehicle slumped over the wheel. When the officer attempted to render aid, the motorist awoke and stated that he just fell asleep and was ok. Motorist refused medical attention and went on his way. Officer did not observe any exigent factors.
- Police were notified of a faulty traffic light on East Shore Road and Arleigh Road. Upon arrival it was determined that the light was not cycling properly and the repair company was notified to respond. Light was put into caution mode until repaired.
- A Beverly Road resident requested police after being locked out of home. Police were unable to gain access but were able to contact a local family member with a key.
