Auto Accidents:

04/02- A resident of Beverly Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering a possible infection.

- Police responded to an Arleigh Road resident in regards to a complaint of a parked car carrier. Police spoke with resident to advise that no violations were observed. No police action.
- Police responded to Beverly Road and Park Road for a complaint of two people arguing. Upon arrival, police located a vehicle matching the description and spoke with the two occupants who denied arguing and left scene.
- Kensington PD assisted NCPD with a canvass of the area after a notification of a burglary was broadcast in Great Neck Plaza. Negative results with the canvass.
- A resident of Bridal Path reports they hear screaming outside. A canvass of the area produced negative results.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
