Auto Accidents:

Aided Cases:

Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 21. All were found to be secure.

Miscellaneous:

- A suspicious vehicle was reported to have pulled into a driveway on Beverly Road. Police responded and were unable to locate any vehicle matching the description given.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- Solicitors were removed from village after police were alerted to their presence. There was no permit on file and subject was advised of village ordinance and agreed to leave.
- The Kensington Police Department provided assistance with road closures and traffic control during the Memorial Day Parade.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Police investigated a loud noise complaint in the vicinity of Sutton Court and deemed it unfounded after an extensive canvass of the area.
- Police assisted highway department after a tree on Arleigh Road fell and was blocking the roadway. Tree was cut up and moved to allow traffic to flow.
- Police responded to 1 Kensington Gate for a medical alert activation. Upon arrival, it was determined to be set in error by owner of alert. No medical attention required.
- A displaced manhole cover on Nassau Drive and East Drive was properly reseated.
- A report of a loose/unleashed dog in vicinity of village green was investigated and police were unable to locate animal.
- A suspicious vehicle on Nassau Drive was reported on Nassau Drive. A vehicle matching the description was located and a vehicle stop conducted. Proper identification and purpose was verified and occupants released from scene.
- A complaint of a pedestrian refusing to leave 1 Kensington Gate property was received by police. Upon arrival of the police the pedestrian complied and left the scene.
