Auto Accidents:

Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 22. All were found to be secure.

Miscellaneous:

- An Accident involving village report was filed after a tree fell on a vehicle being parked in the lower lot of the pool. No injuries were reported and owner was notified.
- Several contractors/landscapers were verbally warned that they were in violation of current village ordinances and ceased activity. All complied and pledged to correct action in future.
- Police investigated a report of a suspicious white SUV on Beverly Road. Upon arrival, the vehicle was located and found to be a guest of a neighboring home.
- Police investigated a possible report of a missing/ run away youth on Arleigh Road. Police quickly located youth in a nearby park and same returned home voluntarily. No further police action required.
- Several trees/limbs were removed from roadway during times of high winds throughout the month.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- A suspicious vehicle on Beverly Road was reported. Upon arrival the vehicle was located and found to be a personal vehicle belonging to a member of Hatzalah.
- Police responded to a 1 Kensington Gate apartment for a 911 hang up. Upon arrival it was determined that all was ok and it was dialed in error.
- While on patrol, police observed a large amount of water pouring into roadway from a Sutton Court residence. Police notified owner and DPW. Water main was shut off and utility company notified to respond.
- A report of 2 males on bikes wearing masks in the vicinity of Beverly Road and MNR. Police responded and after an extensive canvass, were unable to locate subjects.
- Police responded to a verbal dispute between a mother and her 9-year-old daughter. The daughter called police after the mother refused to allow the daughter to play video games before homework was completed. Situation corrected and no police action required.
- A suspicious vehicle on Beverly Road was reported. The vehicle was no longer at scene upon police arrival and a check of the area produced negative results.
- A dislodged manhole cover at the intersection of Beverly Road and MNR was properly reset back into place.
