Auto Accidents:

- Suspicious vehicle with occupants on Beverly Road was reported. Upon arrival it was determined to be the resident of the home talking on the phone.
- A village light pole on Beverly Road was knocked down by unknown vehicle. Hwy department was notified to remove pole and village hall notified for replacement.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Police were notified of possible tampering of lawn signs. No video or description of subjects was located. Information was posted at HQ for further investigation.
- Police were notified that the road sign at the entrance to the village was damaged and falling. Hwy was notified and sign was repaired.
