

# Monthly Police Report

## October 2024

### Auto Accidents:

10/04- A one vehicle accident occurred on North Drive after a motorist reversed their vehicle into a tree. No injuries reported and vehicle towed from scene.

### Aided Cases:

10/06- A bicyclist was transported to North Shore Hospital after striking a stop sign while riding. Aided was suffering from severe abdominal pain

10/07- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was transported to North Shore Hospital after a fall in the home caused a head laceration.

10/10- A Nassau Drive resident was assisted after a fall in the home. Aided was checked at scene but refused further medical attention or transport to hospital.

10/14- A Beverly Road resident reports their 8-month-old was choking. Police responded and found infant to be breathing upon arrival. Aided was transported to Cohens Children center for evaluation.

10/19- A resident of Nassau Drive was transported to North Shore Hospital after fainting and striking their head during the fall.

10/24- A resident of Beverly Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering from difficulty breathing due to chronic disease.

### Ambulance Calls:

The Vigilant Fire Company Ambulance responded to all of the above aided cases.

### Fires:

10/03- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to a Beverly Road home for a general fire alarm. Upon arrival, it was determined that the alarm was faulty. No damage.

damage. All Procedures and paperwork were filed and home was boarded up for safety.

### Larcenies:

Nothing to report.

### Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 17. All were found to be secure.

### Miscellaneous:

- Police assisted with a disabled motorist on Beverly Road. Situation was unable to be rectified and a private tow company removed vehicle from roadway.
- Police were called to a North Drive home for a welfare check that was originated in NYC. Upon arrival it was determined that the party of interest was not at scene and the address issued was incorrect.
- Police responded to a house fire on Nassau drive. Fire originated in garage and upon police arrival, all occupants were out of the home. Vigilant was on scene to extinguish the flames. Police secured scene until boarded up. NCPD Arson/Bomb on scene and Nassau County Fire Marshall. No injuries.
- While on patrol, police stopped a suspicious vehicle driving on Arleigh Road. While questioning driver, it was determined that the registration was suspended. Driver was removed to North Shore Hospital after being unable to answer simple questions and appearing disoriented. Vehicle was impounded.
- Police were called for deceased wildlife on East Shore Road. Highway Department notified and removed animal from roadway.
- A water issue was reported by a neighbor on North Drive. The property owner was notified and gave police permission to enter premise and shut off source of issue.
- Police were dispatched to 1 Kensington Gate for a medical alert activation. Upon arrival it was determined to be a false alarm and owner of medical alert was no longer on scene.
- While on patrol a suspicious person was seen walking around an Arleigh Road home. Upon questioning this individual, it was determined to be a guest of the home that was unable to sleep and wanted fresh air. No Further action required.
- A speeding vehicle was reported on Nassau Drive. Police responded and canvassed area but were unable to locate vehicle.
- Several signs were placed on village property in violation of a village ordinance. Signs were removed to HQ.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Police were notified of signs removed from one home and placed at the door of another. Video footage was given to police from a ring camera and the investigation is ongoing. Signs were returned to owner by police.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month and submitted to the village hall for repair.
- Police were called to Beverly Road, in the vicinity of Park Road, for debris in the roadway. Upon arrival police observed clothing scattered about the roadway. Highway department was notified and responded to remove debris.
- Police were notified of a vehicle blocking a driveway on Arleigh Road. Upon arrival, police were able to locate the registered owner and the vehicle was moved.
