

Monthly Police Report

August 2025

Auto Accidents:

08/09- A two vehicle collision occurred on East Shore Road and Arleigh Road. No injuries were reported and no vehicles towed from scene.
08/15- A vehicle traveling eastbound on Beverly Road veered off the roadway and struck a village owned light pole. A report was taken and forwarded to village hall and several summonses issued. No injuries.

Aided Cases:

08/10- An officer of the department sustained a laceration to the arm while effecting a lawful arrest. Aided refused further medical attention at scene.
08/11- A resident of North Drive was assisted in the home after suffering a fall but refused further medical attention or transport to hospital.
08/12- A male pedestrian was walking on the sidewalk on Beverly Road and tripped and fell. Aided was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering a laceration to the hand caused by the glass bottle the aided was carrying.
08/25- A resident of Beverly Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering difficulty breathing.
08/30- A resident of Beverly Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering a laceration to the face from a fall in the home.

Ambulance Calls:

The Vigilant Fire Company Ambulance responded to all of the above aided cases.

Alarms:

The Department responded to 12 active alarms during the month; all were found to be false burglar alarms.

Arrests:

08/10- A resident of Beverly Road was arrested and processed by NCPD detectives at the 6th precinct for an active warrant. All paperwork was filed and forwarded to the proper departments.

Assists:

Assistance was given to Great Neck Estates Police Department 15 times, and received from Great Neck Estates Police Department 1 times.

Burglaries:

Nothing to report.

Cases:

08/09- A case report was taken for a dispute between two relatives on Beverly Road. One of the involved was not at scene upon police arrival. All paperwork was filed and forwarded to NCPD 6th squad.
08/24- A case report was filed for possible stolen property from an Arleigh Road home. NCPD detectives were notified and all paperwork forwarded for further investigation.

Fires:

08/03- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to the vicinity of Nassau Drive and Gilchrest Road for a smell of gas. After an extensive search it was deemed unfounded by FD.
08/05- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to a North Drive home for a CO2 detector. Upon arrival, high levels of CO2 detected by officers' meter. House was evacuated. Upon arrival of FD, it was determined to be a faulty gas stove causing issue. House was aired out by FD and owners were permitted to reenter. No injuries reported and damage was contained to stove.

08/10- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to a North Drive home for a CO2 detector activation. Upon arrival it was determined that a faulty detector caused the alarm. No damage.

08/29- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to an Arleigh Road home for a fire alarm activation. Upon arrival it was determined that the homeowner was programming the alarm and caused the alarm to activate. No damage.

08/31- The Vigilant Fire Company responded to a Beverly Road home for a CO2 detector activation. Upon arrival it was determined that a faulty detector caused the alarm. No damage.

Larcenies:

Nothing to report.

Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 28. All were found to be secure.

Miscellaneous:

- A complaint of an alarm sounding on Beverly Road was reported to police. A canvass of the area was conducted and the source was found to be a vehicle alarm. The vehicle was checked and found to be in order and the owner was notified.
- A suspicious female taking pictures from the street was reported on Beverly Road. Police responded but were unable to locate anyone matching the description given.
- Police assisted the building department with a stop work order on Beverly Road.
- Police were notified of a possible rabid racoon on East Shore Road. Police were unable to locate animal in question but complainant called a wildlife removal company, which were responding to further search the area.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- A power outage was reported within the village affecting 60 homes. Electric company notified and responded to repair outage.
- A report of a suspicious vehicle with occupants on Nassau Drive was investigated. Upon arrival it was found to be a worker being dropped off to work in the home.
- NCPD was assisted by Kensington PD with a serious auto accident in NCPD jurisdiction. Multiple aided were removed to North Shore Hospital and traffic was diverted around accident.
- An unknown vehicle struck a light pole on Nassau Drive. An accident involving village was filed and given to village clerk for repair.
